DAY 1 – FLIGHT TO CAMBODIA (crossing the international date line and arriving on DAY 3)

Crossing time zones and the International Date Line as we head toward the heart of Cambodia.

DAY 3 – LAND TOUR START DAY: PHNOM PENH

Step off the plane and into the vibrant heart of Cambodia. Phnom Penh, the bustling capital, hums with energy, and today is ours to unwind and soak it all in. In the evening, we gather with fellow travelers for a welcome dinner featuring authentic Khmer flavors — a delicious first taste of the adventure ahead.

DAY 4 – PHNOM PENH

Dive into Phnom Penh's rich history and culture as we wander the glittering halls of the Royal Palace and marvel at the treasure-filled Silver Pagoda. The National Museum of Khmer Arts offers a stunning showcase of over 5,000 artifacts, from bronze sculptures to intricate carvings. Midday, we pause for lunch at a local restaurant, sampling classic Cambodian flavors before continuing our discoveries. Climb the sacred hill of Wat Phnom, then feel the pulse of the city at Central Market, a 1930s architectural gem teeming with color, scents, and local life. The day also takes a reflective turn with a visit to Choeng Ek, where history leaves a profound imprint.

DAY 5 – PHNOM PENH – SIEM REAP

We begin with a poignant exploration of Tuol Sleng, the former S-21 prison turned museum, offering insight into Cambodia's recent past. Along the journey to Siem Reap, make a stop at the lively Spider Market, a local hotspot where the unexpected awaits. Wander among stalls bursting with colorful textiles, handicrafts, and quirky curios, feeling the energy of locals negotiating and sharing stories. Just a short distance away, pause at Naga Bridge, an iconic landmark spanning the river, where we can stretch our legs, snap photos, and take in the scenic views of Cambodia's countryside before continuing toward the ancient wonders of Siem Reap. In the evening, gather for dinner at a local restaurant, sampling regional specialties and unwinding after the day's journey.

DAY 6 – SIEM REAP – ANGKOR WAT

Wake early to discover Banteay Srei, a small temple famous for its intricate pink sandstone carvings. Next, experience the awe-inspiring Angkor Wat, the architectural jewel of Cambodia, where sprawling galleries, courtyards, and bas-reliefs tell stories from centuries past. We pause at a nearby restaurant, enjoying a break to taste local Cambodian dishes before continuing our adventure. In the afternoon, explore Ta Prohm, the jungle-covered temple made famous by Tomb Raider, where massive tree roots wrap around ancient stone. We end the day at Angkor Thom, home to the enigmatic Bayon Temple, the Royal Enclosure, and terraces adorned with monumental carvings — an unforgettable journey through history.

DAY 7 – SIEM REAP – HO CHI MINH CITY

See Siem Reap from a fresh perspective as we hop on a tuk-tuk and glide through the leafy pathways of the Royal Independence Gardens, feeling the city come alive around us. The adventure continues at the bustling “Old Market,” where vibrant stalls overflow with spices, textiles, and local crafts, and the mingling aromas, colors, and chatter create a sensory tapestry we won’t forget. Later, we board our flight and trade the streets of Cambodia for the dynamic energy of Ho Chi Minh City, where a dinner cruise along the shimmering Saigon River invites us to unwind and watch the city’s skyline light up, setting the perfect tone for our first night in Vietnam.

DAY 8 – HO CHI MINH CITY

We step back in time at the Cu Chi Tunnels, an astonishing network of underground passages that tell the story of Vietnamese resilience, then return to the city to explore the Reunification Palace, the Notre Dame Cathedral, the Central Post Office, and the War Remnants Museum, gaining perspective on the country’s complex history. Cap the evening with a magical water puppet show, a centuries-old art form performed on a shimmering stage of water.

DAY 9 – HO CHI MINH CITY – OPTIONAL MEKONG DELTA EXCURSION

The day is ours to explore Ho Chi Minh City at our own pace, whether that means lingering in hidden cafés, browsing bustling markets, or finding quiet corners off the beaten path. For those of us who choose the optional excursion to the Mekong Delta, we trade the city streets for lush waterways. Glide through winding canals in a traditional boat, stop at a brick kiln, and visit coconut workshops where we sample handmade sweets. In a peaceful village, try our hand at age-old crafts like sleeping mat weaving, then drift along in a rowing boat beneath swaying palms. A local lunch rounds out the experience before returning to Ho Chi Minh City.

DAY 10 – FLY HOME OR CONTINUE ON THE OPTIONAL EXTENSION TO HANOI AND HA LONG BAY

If this is where your adventure ends, enjoy a leisurely breakfast before heading to the airport. Take home memories of bustling markets, breathtaking temples, and unforgettable experiences along the Mekong and beyond. The rest of us continue with a flight to Hanoi, the bustling capital of Vietnam. Upon arrival, our local guide leads us straight into the heart of the city. Start at Ba Dinh Square, where the most solemn ceremonies unfold, and glimpse the iconic Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum from the outside — a place of deep respect and history. Nearby, the unique One-Pillar Pagoda rises delicately from its single stone pillar, a symbol of harmony and ingenuity dating back to 1049. Then, hop on a traditional “cyclo” to weave through Hanoi’s famous 36 Streets, a labyrinth of narrow alleys and shop houses, each street historically named for the goods sold there — from fabrics to crafts to herbal medicines. We pause at the serene Ngoc Son Temple on Hoan Kiem Lake before dinner at KOTO Van Mieu, where a meal supports disadvantaged youth learning life and hospitality skills.

DAY 11 – HANOI

Fueled by strong Vietnamese coffee, we kick off the day diving into Vietnam’s past at the Museum of Ethnology — a vibrant crash course in the country’s 54 ethnic groups, complete with stilt houses you can walk through and traditional outfits that look straight out of a festival. From there, we make our way to Tran Quoc Pagoda, floating peacefully on West Lake like something from a postcard, before stepping into the Temple of Literature — Vietnam’s first university. After lunch, things take a darker turn at Hoa Lo Prison, aka the “Hanoi Hilton,” a gritty window into Vietnam’s wartime past. We wrap it up at St. Joseph’s Cathedral, a French-built Gothic church that looks like Notre Dame’s stylish younger cousin — the perfect spot to snap a few golden-hour shots before hunting down happy hour.

DAY 12 – HANOI – HA LONG BAY

After breakfast, leave the city behind as we transfer to the legendary Ha Long Bay, a UNESCO World Heritage wonder. We board our cruise and toast our arrival with a welcome drink as the karst limestone islands rise dramatically from emerald waters. The day is ours to embrace the bay: swim in hidden coves, paddle through quiet channels by kayak, explore mysterious caves, and join a hands-on cooking demonstration with the cruise team. Fresh, local flavors fill every meal, with lunch and dinner served on board as we drift through one of the world’s most breathtaking seascapes.

DAY 13 – HA LONG BAY

We wake to a morning framed by soaring limestone peaks and calm waters. Spend a full day on the water — swim, kayak, or simply soak up the sun on the sundeck while taking in the surreal scenery. Explore hidden corners of the bay, capture the perfect photos, or sip coffee as mist rolls across the islands. Meals continue to delight with local cuisine prepared on board. Another night on the cruise ensures we are fully immersed in Ha Long Bay’s tranquil magic.

DAY 14 – FLIGHT HOME

Our final morning on the water begins with breakfast as the cruise slowly winds back toward shore. We take in the last panoramic views of the bay before checking out. A farewell brunch on board rounds out our floating retreat. Then, we transfer to Hanoi’s Noi Bai Airport for our flight home, carrying memories of emerald waters, towering limestone cliffs, and a truly unforgettable escape.
