LAUSANNE	Olympic Museum The Olympic Museum is a must-see when visiting Lausanne for sports fans. The museum is home to permanent and temporary exhibits relating to sports and the Olympic movement. With more than 10,000 artifacts, the museum is the largest archive of Olympic games in the world, and is one of Lausanne's prime tourist sites, attracting more than 250,000 visitors each year!	\$ Hours: 9:00 am - 6:00 pm; closed on Mondays. 	Collection de l'Art Brut Creative genius Jean Dubuffet began gathering works by self-taught creators in 1945, and later donated them in 1945 to the city of Lausanne, which, in 1976, inaugurated the Collection de l'Art Brut at the Château de Beaulieu. This "collection of raw art" invites visitors to reflect on and understand these artists who are not artists.	\$ Hours: 11:00 am - 6:00 pm; closed on Mondays.
